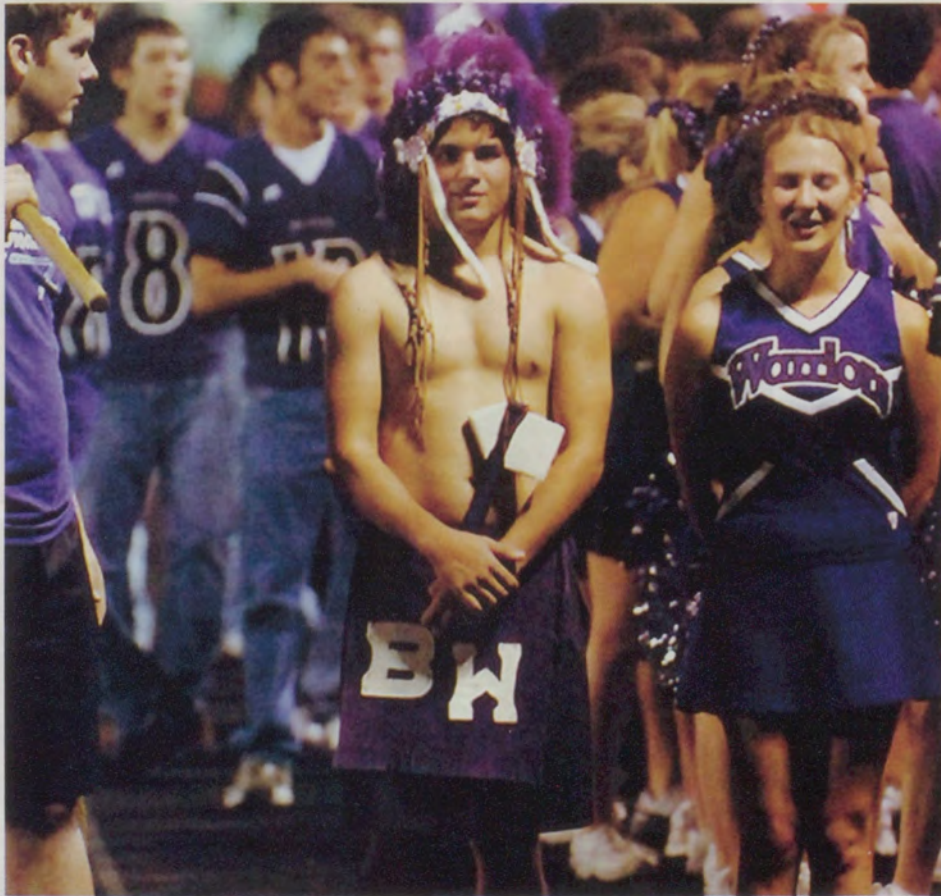

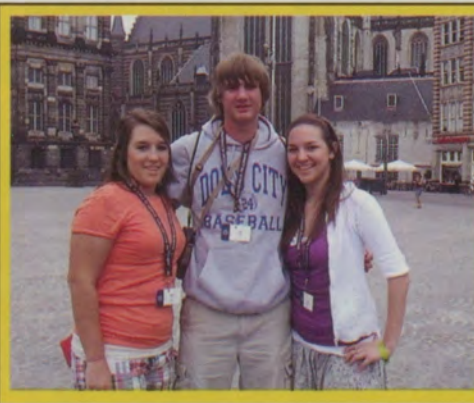

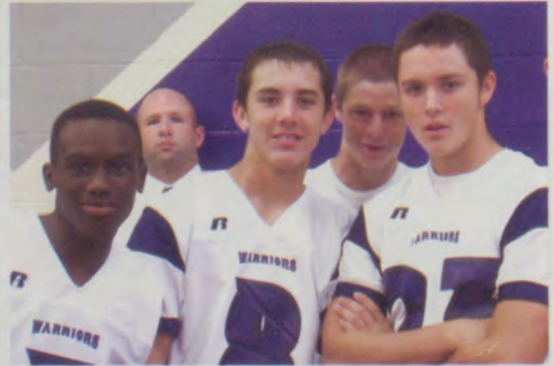

November 20, 2007.

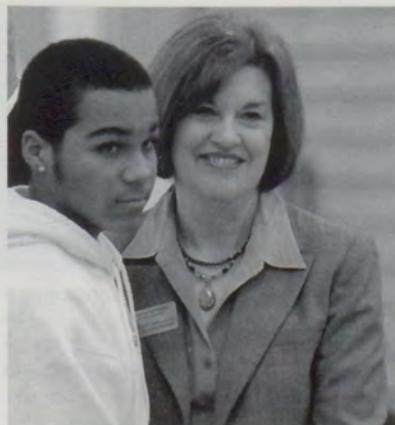
The Bonham Education Foundation rewards those students who have maintained a G.P.A of 4.0 or higher from the previous school year.

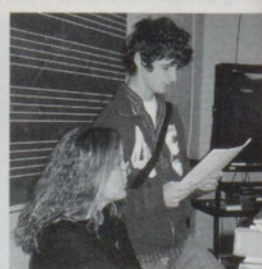

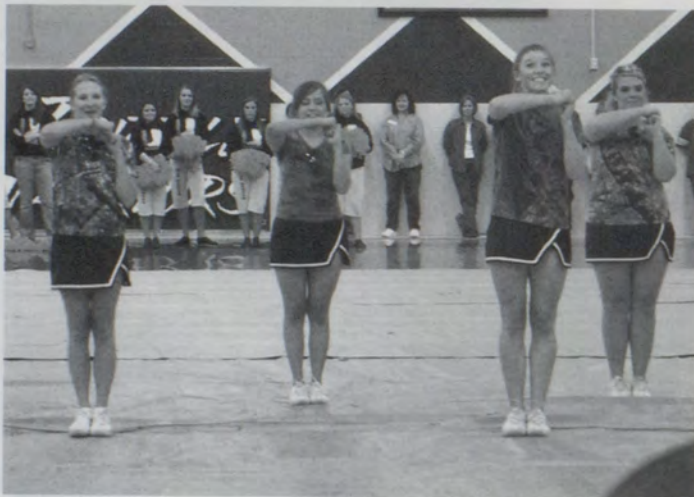

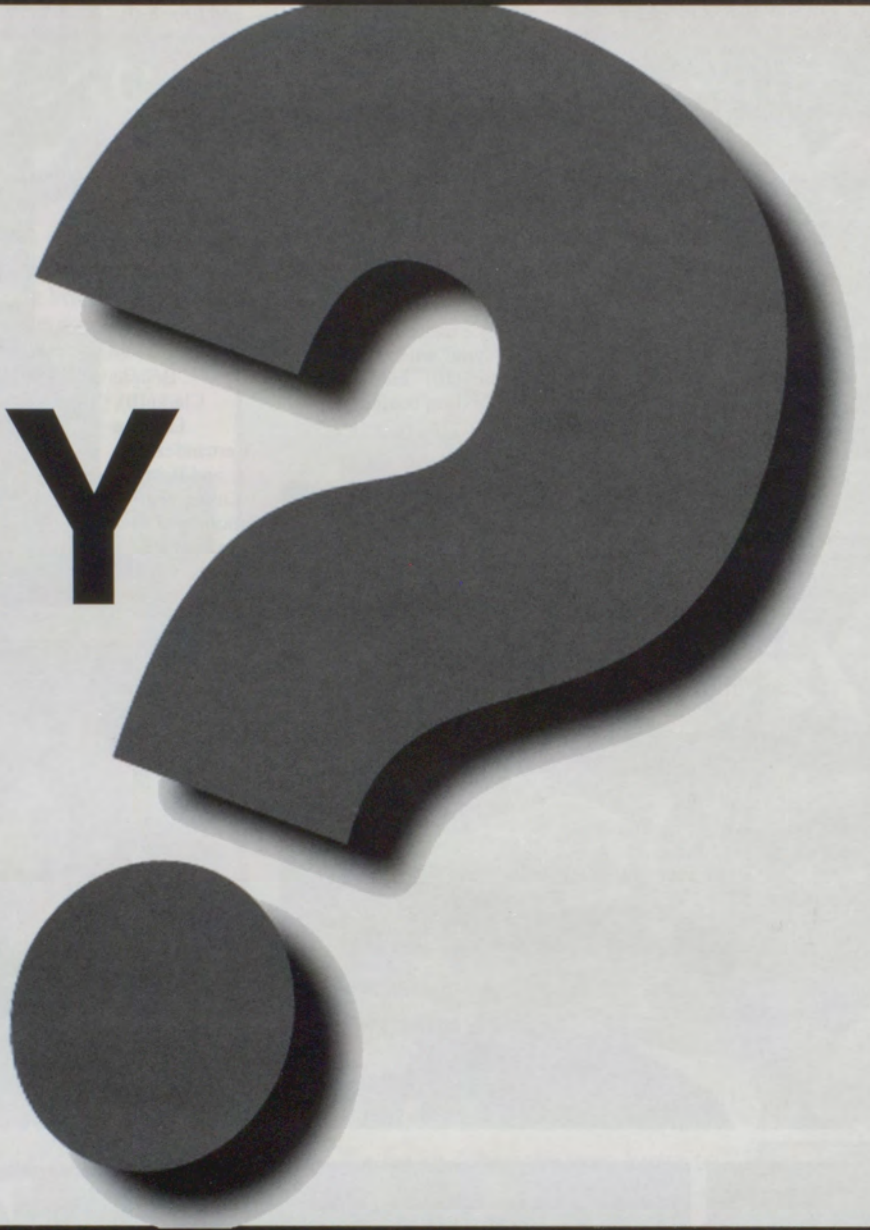

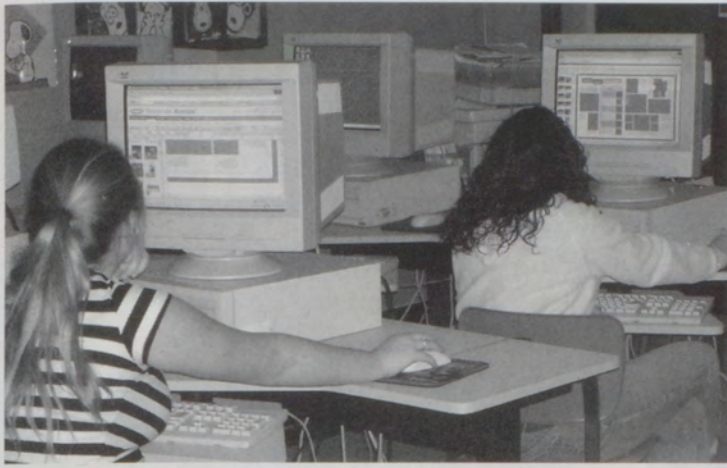

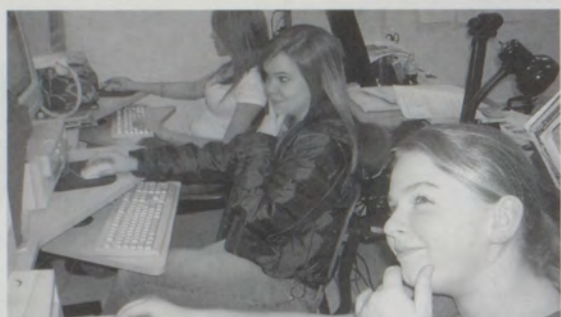

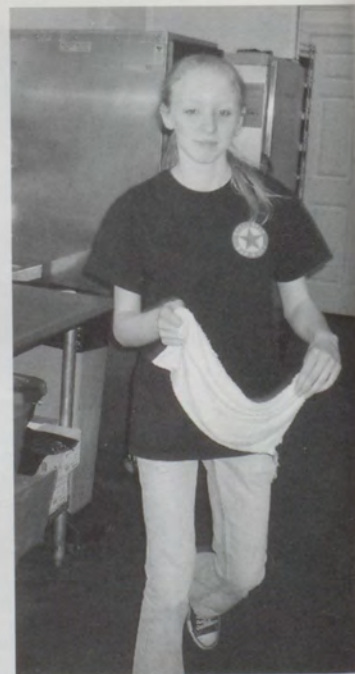

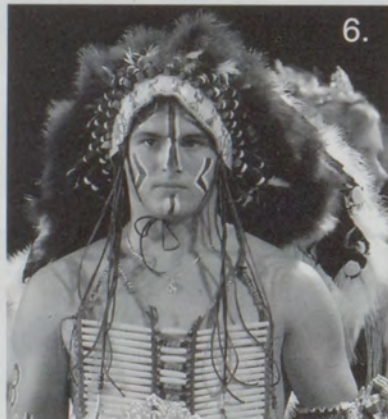

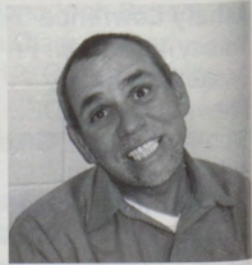

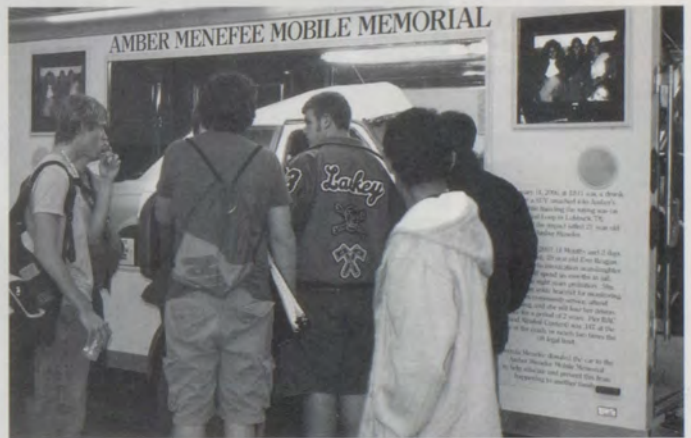

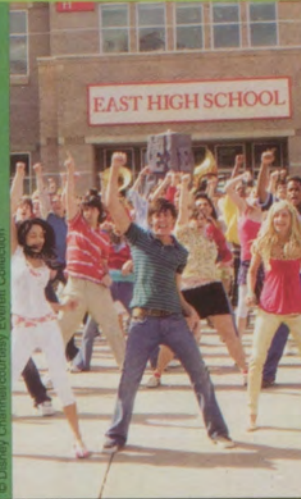

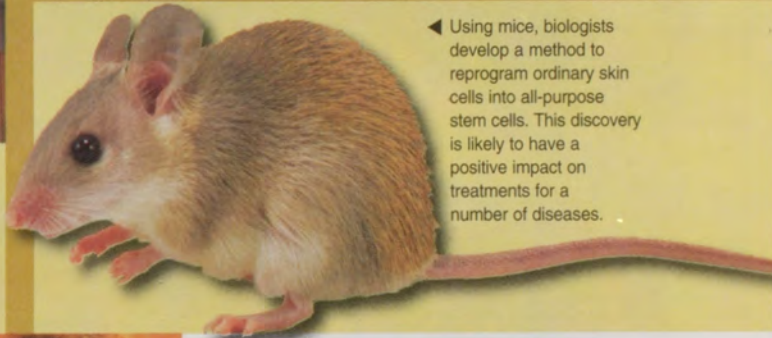

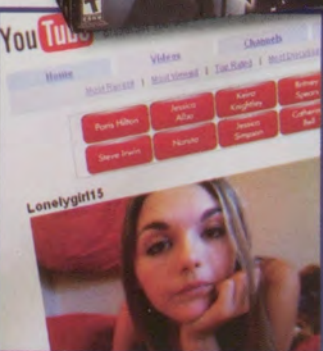

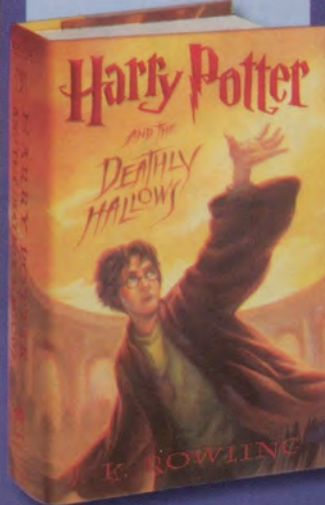

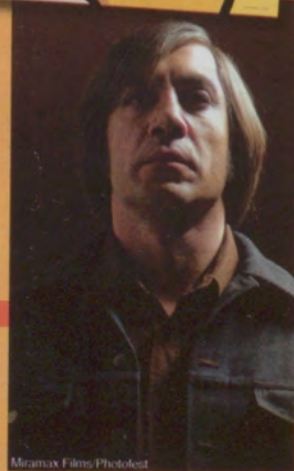

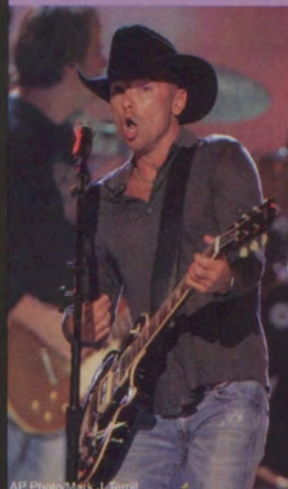

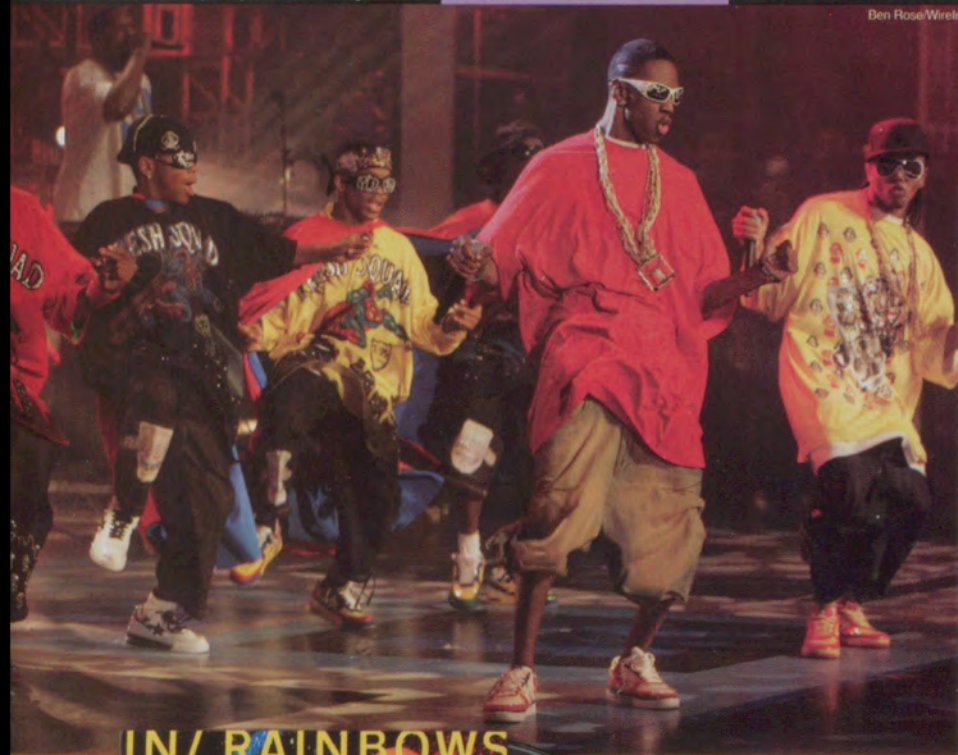

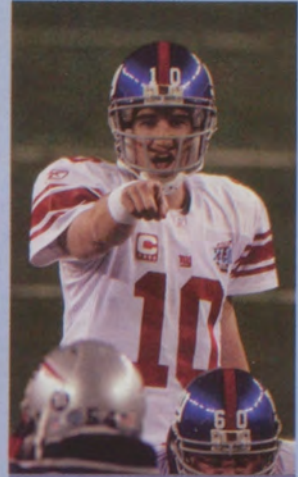

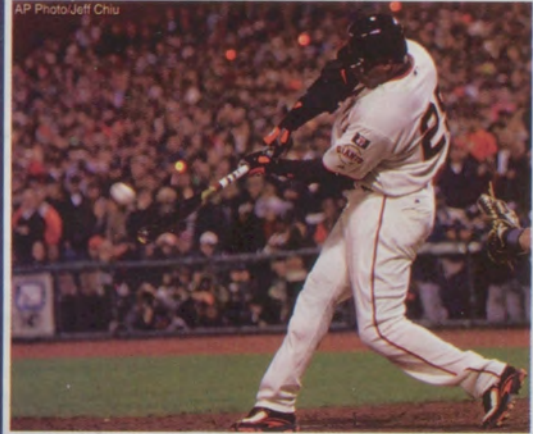

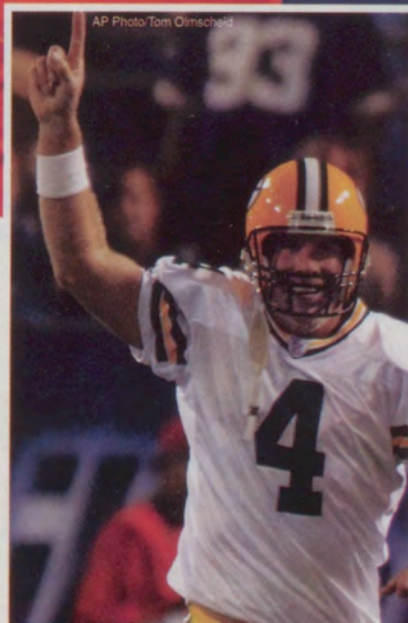
