Sencitor Devell Addresses Crowd At Bonham Academic Excellence Awards Stressing Importance of Education

"You can't go anywhere without an education," said Senator Bob Deuell. "The quality of life you have in the future depends upon the education you recieve now."

He addressed the crowd assembled in the gymnasium on Nov. 14, 2011, for the annual Bonham Academic Excellence Awards. During his speech, Senator Deuell stressed the importance of getting an education and especially the need for seniors to attend college.








Rachel's Kickoff Rally was held September 23, 2011 for 7th-12th graders at Bonham High School. Superintendent Sonny Cruse introduced Cody Hodges, from the Rachel's Challenge organization, who presented what Rachel's Challenge is all about. Bonham ISD accepted Rachel's Challenge for the first time in September 2008 after being inspired by Rachel's story. The ending rally was May 24, where the chain links were counted and students and teachers cut their hair for donating to Share the Hair. On Oct. 4, the sophomore class completed a Chain Reaction Day. The day of events targeted the key areas of attidude, behavior, and values. The students engaged in relevant discussions about bullying and painful life experiences. 
