COMMERCE, --The East Texas State University Brass Choir will be featured in concert at 8 p.m. Monday (April 17) in Greenville.

The concert, sponsored by the Greenville Community Concert Series, will be held in the city's Municipal Auditorium.

The Brass Choir, under the direction of Conrad R. Bauschka, will perform eight works. The Choir will open with "Canzon duodecimi toni" by Giovanni Gabrieli.
