DEFENSE PRODUCTION ACCOUNTING COURSE OFFERING

Those who are interested in pursuing a part-time course in the basic elements of industrial accounting should contact Dean A. C. Ferguson or B. T. Jones concerning the course which will have its first meeting Wednesday evening, October 21 at 7 p.m. in L-106 on the East Texas State Campus.

This course is sponsored by the Engineering, Science, Management, War Training Program of the United States Department of Education in cooperation with the War Manpower Commission and associated agencies of our national defense program.

The purpose of the course is to give training and increased responsibility, improved technique, and new employment in fields essential to the national war effort. The course is of college grade with prerequisites of high school graduation or equivalent with business experience and is open to women and to men who have dependents or who are classified as 4-F. There is no cost to the student other than the usual cost of textbook, paper, and pencils.

The class will meet on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 7 til 10 p.m. in L-106 for a period of twelve weeks.
