SCHOLARSHIPS AWARDED IN ETSU COMPUTER SCIENCE CONTEST

COMMERCE, --Seven \$100 tuition scholarships were awarded to the first place winners in the Computer Science Programming Contest which was held at East Texas State University March 11 (Saturday).

The contest was sponsored by the ETSU Department of Computer Science in cooperation with the Division of Continuing Education. Eight Texas junior colleges participated in the competition for the scholarships which were awarded to each winning team member of the FORTRAN and COBOL divisions.

Winners of the FORTRAN division were San Antonio College students Laurence L. Andrews, Terry L. Askew and Linneaus O. Maurer.

Winners of the COBOL division were Tyler Junior College students William Smith, Jr., Shirley Marshall, Cynthia Davidson and Debbie Sorrells.

College of the Mainland students Christie A. Ferrino, Stanley Abraham and Donald L. Moon took second place in the FORTRAN division.

Second place winners in the COBOL division were Danny Offill, Robert Griffin and John McKinstry of Grayson County Junior College.

Second place finishers received plaques and certificates to commemorate their accomplishment.

Other junior colleges which participated in the contest were Brazosport College, El Centro College, Texarkana College and Navarro Junior College.

Sending observers were Paris Junior College, San Jacinto College, Kilgore College, Mountain View Junior College, Panola Junior College and Wharton County Junior College.
