We can be glad that there is little evidence in favor of the Akron. She began her brief career by breaking loose from her mooring mast and bare out her nose. Then, when an investigating committee from Congress was starting here to inspect the huge airship, she suddenly threw herself against the ground, creating an unfavorable impression upon the worthy members of Congress.

Lately, in one of her most moods, she took off without ceremony, carrying with her three members of her ground crew clinging at the end of long ropes. Only one of those men survived. The other two dropped to their deaths.

Congress is waggling. The same tongues that would have severed the throat of modern aviation when the Wright brothers were experimenting at Kitty Hawk are at it again.

The Akron disaster is ghastly—and should cause every American to mourn. By the same token every American should be ready to defend American engineering and to boast lighter-than-air craft, especially the rigid kind.

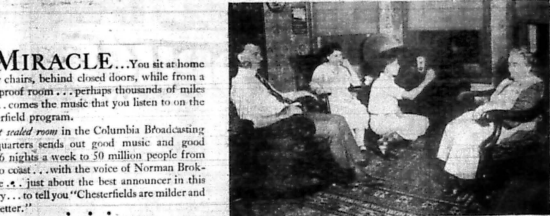

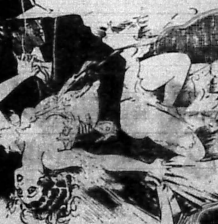
