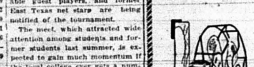

In Defense of Change

At least once in each person's life there comes a time when he finds himself standing in a narrow, beaten path which leads always in the same direction and gets nowhere. If followed too long, this path soon develops into a rut, and a rut is not better than a grave with both ends open.

The staff felt that The East Texan had been running in such a groove; that some change needed to take place. There were some of these changes were made, as you may have already noticed. In making these changes, we were not arbitrarily overthrowing traditions which have been set by those who have gone before. Traditions are fine and we do have around the paper, but they become stumbling blocks, they should be put out.

New Method

We now want things truly stumbling blocks. For instance, the old front-page masthead with its half hidden mast-head were unattractively by had lettering, its crooked lines, its form which have been moved to the inside of the page, they belong and the lack of space for boxes or "ears," on each side. The new masthead, we feel, is a great improvement. Compare this issue with that of some previous year, and see the difference.

Headed

Our ragged-edges, or flush, headlines have created both favorable and unfavorable comment. Even the editor did not exactly approve of the first set of newspapers, he felt that which they were, they are quite converted to the change now. Following the examples set by the Daily Texan, (University of Texas), the Chicago Tribune, The Kentucky, and many other great papers, colleges and universities, we have adopted this new type of head. Ragged-edges are superior to the old balanced head in that there is no longer a strict demand that the headline meanings be forced into a mold with only a count or two for variation; the reader can get a much better idea of what is in the story than he generally did when he had to waste through three or four columns of matter type, which he generally did not do at all; they stand out better, making for a more lively page; they are easier to write, thus leaving more time for the writer to spend on the article. It is just making for a higher quality news writing. These and many others, are our reasons for the change.

Departments

Another great improvement is in the use of departments in which straight news, society news, sport news, and literary material are segregated. This leads not only to ease on the part of the work of the staff in compiling news, but it is more satisfactory to the reader. The reader is looking for a certain type of article. Rather than search through the whole paper for, say, a write-up on some one, he may turn to the society page and find it. The same applies to the other departments.

Two new columns, especially, should be of value to the student.

With all announcements it is made, from those issued by the officials of the school to the calling of class meetings, the "Editorial" and "From Our Readers" pages are of great importance, and probably more so, in all items of this nature will be found under "Official Notice" each week.

The other is the "From Our Readers" column in which the student may have a chance to express himself on any subject he chooses. This should be of great benefit to many who have something worthwhile to say, but have no chance to say it. It is hoped that the students will take advantage of this opportunity.
