### A Revised Curriculum For The Teacher Or The Child?

We wonder what the child would think of a curricular meeting, if he were priviledged to set in on one of these heated sessions. Maybe he would not understand, but if it were explained to him that the discussion concerned what he should learn at school, he would surely have ideas of his own about what interested him. Sometimes we think Sometimes we think that it would be better to take his judgment than some of those who are in charge of the curriculum

Do not misunderstand. Curriculum revision. constant entreining, is to be commended, and it is a long overthin beform of our American school sys-tem, but the methods of the present movement are to be questioned. They say, "The curriculum needs to be revised does it. Well, suppose we ask some of our teachers how. Mr. Math Teacher, what do you think about it?"

M. T. "Yes, am sure that the curriculum could be improved. In fact, I have several excellent mod-ern math courses in mind that I have felt needed a place in the curriculum a long time.
"And you, Miss Music Teacher."

"Yes, Mr. Administrator, I have for many yeas, ser, Administrator, I have for many years been working for an entiched curriculum, and I feel that nothing can add more culture and enrichment to a person's life than the appreciation of good music. Undoubtedly there should be more music in the school."

And so on indefinitely to every kind of teacher there is. They all believe in their subject, that the world would be ever so much better with more of it, and that the progress of civilization would stop without it, and rightly so. They should believe in their subject, and they are probably are right that civilization would suffer a distinct loss without it, but that is all irrevelent to the question that the movement should be seeking to answer. What will should be put into the common school to 'en-rich the life of the child, 6-16 years old.
