6. Degrading men from upright law-abiding citizens into nothing more than wild beasts with no control whatever over their physical or mental faculties.
7. Producing 20 per cent of the divorcees, 25 per cent of insanity, 37 per cent of poverty, 47 per cent of child labor and 50 per cent of crime.
8. Being a habit forming narcotic.
9. Having no food value at all.

Therefore, let us, in fairness to ourselves and our posterity, in service to our country, and in devotion to our God, take up this problem, dear friends, boldly.

Resolving that on August 24 of this year there will do hereby pledge ourselves to use our support in keeping out of our grand state that evil and mind weakening, and as we see the work of it, we shall refrain from the use of alcohol, 1935
