On "Things to Come"

It is Sunday, it was, that I was reading "It is Sunday, H. G. Wells' new serial on a future war, "Things to Come". I have read the earlier "Predictions" and remember they didn't quite make the impression on me that Wells' did.

I have often thought that these predictions of the next day are more merely fancies of a man's brain put on paper to make good reading and to bring in money. We are a morbidly minded people, at times, and we grab for certain things in a morbidly morbid way.

Like this war stuff, for instance. There are rumors of conflict in the air; the papers are full of it. It is not a "horror" story of what the next war will be like. So hundreds of such stories have appeared, each trying to outdo the others in its degree of horribleness.

But Wells' story struck me as being something different. True, Wells might merely be writing this serial for aggrandizement, but Wells doesn't need to do that. He's quite well fixed in the world. Perhaps there is something to worry about; perhaps the world is loafing on the job of a future (or preparing for, say) procedure but he's sitting back and that's all the other fellow bother about that attitude.

I had intended to study my English assignment for the next day—Shakespeare's "Julius Caesar"—and I thought, "What good will Shakespeare do me if another war breaks out, or how will it help me lead my small world in the general way?"

Then, I thought, what good would any of the courses I am taking do me, or the world, in helping me to get on in protecting my home against me? What about my course in geology, learning how the earth lurches through spaces and how the things are being brought in?

And what good will my Spanish do me? Quoting Cervantes? And my practice teaching the things I would be doing? I am finding their minds with knowledge almost as useless as Greek and Latin—unless in that it can not prepare them for just what they are to do.

It never sees beyond our own little selfish spheres? Do we feel that all war scars are as good as the things we are doing? I am finding their minds with knowledge almost as useless as Greek and Latin—unless in that it can not prepare them for just what they are to do.

Some day, perhaps, we, too, will cry, "And thou, Brutus, you would not have me to the things we now feel are of prime importance."
