Lions Take 6-0 Win in Opening Game

Defeat Aerial To Garrison Is Only Counter

Taking an unexpected aerial route for the only 100-0 victory of the game, the East Texas state members College football team defeated Garrison 6-0 to victory over the Austin College Kangaroos in a game played Friday night at Sherman.

The Kangaroos' initial drive by a 7 to 6 deflated punt from the back of the line and Gold last season, and made their two most serious threats to score early in the first quarter — a bit of preliminary bulldozing, most startling play of the game — Bill DeFoe's backfield pass to Johnny Clayton.

Fifty Yard Pass

Following the second period when Ezra gained a first down on the A. C. 40 yard strip by kicking a 24 yard punt return by Garrison, the play-off came in the last half. DeFoe's field kick to the midfield marker and found a perfect target in Garrison's line, which was set on the goal line when the ball settled into his arms. The punt fifty fifteen ball was caught only after a half-minute, and Garrison, who had outdistanced the speedy Ted Turner, managed to cover him by means of his arms. The rain did serve to decrease attendance and the admissions figured around the 1,000 mark. More than a hundred there were Commerce citizens and College students, who made the trip through showers to see the Lions off to a good start on the Long shift to the East Texas game.

Rice Shows Defense

The two staves trained on the field probably as well matched as any two power teams will ever be. The Lions displayed a severe jolt in the first minute when Garrison's punt was blocked and returned by A. C. C. on the East Texas 26. There Hill Pierce, coach of St. Edwards, who coached the contest in preparation for his game next Friday, saw the type of defensive defense he will be forced to over come. Three plays gained or set nothing and Austin passed over the goal line on the second down.

Only a few minutes later the Kangaroos thrust their punting, leaving Harris' 25-yard punt scored today. Ezra got down the curtain was down on Austin's offensive attack by the remainder of the team.

Meaning Attack Shows

The Lions' running attack that was used for 100 yards during the game got underway early in the second quarter, when the drive with DeFoe leading the way with a 35-yard journey down the field which was then Texas drew a 15-yard penalty during the drive. Another carried to the Austin 31 yard marker when the halfway whistle.

The Lions' next drive toward their eleven continually threatened. Joe Taylor was the leader in two drives in the third quarter, and he began with the Kangaroo 31 and the other on the 20-yard strip.

East Texas' most desperate effort to score came in the opening minutes of the game. The punter after Morris Grove intercepted an enemy pass and returned it 25 yards to the Austin 13. Then McIlwain's blocked punt was for seven and passed. Montgomery for five more and a first down on the one yard line. Running plays were stopped cold three and the rest of the game was a Kangaroo's vainly trying to regain those six points with a desperate passing

Lions Among Three Upsets in National Williamson Rating

The East Texas Lions caused one of the three upsets in Williamson's rating of the games of the nation last week by beating the Austin College Kangaroos, according to P. W. Williamson, New Orleans football expert, who is published weekly in number of the East Texasian. Williamson's rating is based on the nation before and after games. To date 93 grid teams have engaged in games, and Williamson rates the Lions thirty-fourth in order, four notches above the Kangaroo. He gives Texas a rating of 50.7, with 100.0 being considered perfect.

Only one opponent on the Lion's schedule rated above them in the first rating, namely Louisiana State-Normal, Natchitoches, in two three games with a rating of 53.0, by virtue of giving Cincinnati College a grid night.

Two other opponents on the schedule that are rated at 49.0 and 50, respectively, are Texas Wesleyan who lost to Texas Tech and Southern Texas, who scored a somewhat unimpressive win over an army team. Among the three highest teams in the nation are four teams from Texas.

At the season begins earlier than, it is to be expected that this high percentage of wins will be lowered in weeks to come.

The system includes only teams who have played games and is so percent accurate in predicting the outcome of the nation's games last week. A team with a higher rating is supposed to be able to win from a team with a lower rating.
