The Bears' 12-7 lead looked exceedingly safe as they had previously turned back the Lions three times. The Cat team's victory, however, was a story book game.

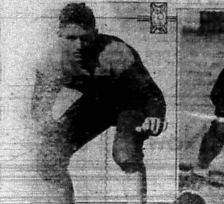
