To Those Who Cry "Dictatorship"...

President Franklin H. Roosevelt says many of his policies meet their fate at the hands of the Supreme Court during his first administration. But the President, being a man of strong conviction and strong will, was determined that a way should be found to enact his social and economic policies into laws that would be above constitutional question.

The opposition at first thought an attempt would be made to amend the Constitution, or a "great cry" was made about the "sacredness" of the Constitution and of the unquestionable "wisdom" of our forefathers. But the majority of Mr. Roosevelt's cabinet members...

The people have spoken. They want a more liberal interpretation of the Constitution. Social and economic life demands it. But there are those who would not permit this reform. Who can deny this right of opposition?
