3 Teachers Return From 44th Meeting Of Child Educators

Ann Workman, Clow Peckren, and Betty Kemmer returned from the forty-fourth annual conference of the American Child Education Association, which met at St. Antonio, March 30 through April 3.

At the convention in San Antonio, resolutions were adopted favoring ratification of the Federal child labor statute and more co-operation with school organizations and women residents of various communities.

The teachers discussed by resolution for work for more wholesome moving pictures, radio, and radio programs for children.

Today's Trends in Childhood Education was the theme of the discussion during the convention. Emphasis was placed on the study of the "child character" and his twenty-four hour day.

The changing world demands a changing curriculum in the educational institutions, but its foundation should be built upon the "child's qualities and character of his own himself," it was stressed.

Three foreign questions and twenty studies by the members were represented by fourteen leaders and teachers of young children.

The Association for Child Education was formed in 1910 by the merging of two organizations of teachers of young children, the International Kindergarten Union, organized in 1882, and the National Association of Primary Education, which was organized in 1903.

The purpose of this organization is to gather and disseminate knowledge of the conditions of the education of young children; to bring into better recognition all childhood education courses; including parent education to promote the progressive type of education in nursery school, kindergarten, and primary grades; and to raise the standard of the professional training for teachers in this field.
