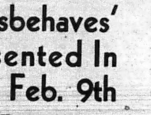

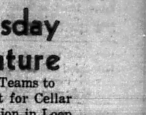

Just as an American, Isadora Duncan, was pioneer in the now accepted field of interpretive dancing, another American, the youthful Ruth Page, baller dancer of the Chicago Grand Opera, is showing the world how the often harsh methods of the modern dance may be made more beautiful and infinitely more appealing when combined with the grace and artistry of the classical ballet.

Miss Page, who will tour the Central-west, South, and East this winter after the close of the Chicago Opera season is one of the few dancers on the concert stage who has had the classical ballet as well as modern dance training and experience.

When she was only 13 years old, she attracted the attention of the great Anna Pavlova, who invited the Indianapolis girl to study with her for a year in St. Petersburg. Later she was a member of the Diaghileff Ballet Ensemble and toured Europe.

She has been a persistent high-caliber giving concerts in practically all the countries of the world. She danced for the Emperor of Imperialist Japan, the democratic ex-king of Siam, and for the workers of Soviet Russia. She toured the Orient, Australia, India, South America, and North America. Many of her engagements were joint recitals with Harold Kriegerberg.

Victory seemed off to salvage the game for the Bobcats in the final minutes of play by a free shot.

Race Trackers Face Hard Nine Meet Schedule

With the International Border Olympics coming up on March 4, the East Texas crowd again is fast rounding into shape for the hardest schedule that an East Texas has ever faced. Nine events comprise the year's schedule with seven of them at home.

Nineteen men will compose the squad this year. Of those twelve are returning lettermen. Two equities from last season, two sophomores, two transfers, and one new candidate make up the remainder of the squad. Four lettermen have yet to report for practice. Gene Hedge, Cecil Price, Johnny Garrison, and Tex Walker are the letter men still unnumbered to be.

Chances Look Bright
 With a letterman back every event and strong new men to confound them, chances look bright for a winning season. Headlining the schedule this year are the Texas Relay on April 1, the Drake Relay on April 10, in Des Moines, Iowa, and the Conference meet in Huntsville, May 14.

Five season expectations indicate that the principle Lion strength will be in the middle and the field events, particularly the high jump. In the running events, the thirty class strength will come in the relay with the rest of the events well balanced but without special power.

The hurdles are well taken care of with Red Webber, two year letterman and second place winner last spring to the high hurdle; Willie Pergandean, Conference record holder; Dickson hurdler; Buster Bourland, one hurdler from Wesley Junior College; Coy Stewart, second hurdler from last season; and Johnny Honey, sophomore timber hopper; all working out in these events.

With William Hunt, conference record holder; Red Webber and Willie Pergandean, consistently getting over six feet, the high jump is due to be a point getting event for the tracksters. Hunt, along with Milton Massey and Durrell Tol-

by will also take care of the broad jump.

New Star Added
 Trick stick took a decided jump when Bob Hays, star point guard from Connor's Junior College, transferred school at mid-term. Hays won the events at the Fort Worth Exposition meet last spring and has scored up into the twelve foot heights. Assistant manager in the pole vault are Gene Hodge and Red Webber.

One of the few first place hits 'East Texas won last year was the shot put. The winner of the event, Cecil Price, is back this year. Priker, Hodge, Tully, and Webber, had fair to make the shot, discus, and javelin, strong events.

The strong 800 and mile relay teams that won honors at the Texas and Kansas relays are back intact with several new men to strengthen them. Lath-er-Lowery, Millard Massey, James Stewart, Willie Stanford, and Johnny Garrison look forward to a big year in relay racing. Buster Bourland - William Hunt; and Tex Walker will make them step to keep their positions.

The bad luck events of the Lone Star Conference will be controlled by Hillard Roberts; James Stewart; Willie Stanford; Earl Dunahoo; and Herchel Spinks. Roberts and Stewart will match their wares against the Flying Brown twins in the dash and 100 yard dash. Dunahoo and Spinks are due to
