Overdue Books and Fines

All Times should be paid for all overdue books when

All Times should be paid for all overdue books when they are returned or as soon there-after as possible All students owing finer must settle these accounts before they are allowed to pay fees for enrolling at the beginning of each term. A fine of \$.25 is imposed upon anyone who does not return a book, magaed upon anyone who does not return a book, maga-zine, or newspaper to the place from which: it was checked out. Five cente-per-houe will be charged for overdue Reserve books. A fine of five cents a day is charged for overdue books not on reserve. Book Loans

A great majority of the books in the library may be A great majority of the books in the library may be lound for a period of two weeks, with renewal privi-ileges. Popular fiction may be lound for seven days, only, with no requesal privileges. Segon day habels are parted below the pockets in such tooks. Refer-cince books are not lounder except by special permis-sion from the librarian. Reserve Loans

Reserve hooks may be horrowed for aver night use at 9:00 P. M. from Monday until Friday and at 12:00 clock on Saturday. All reserve loans are due by 8:30 of the next school day.

8:30 of the next school day, Reserve Room Books placed on Reserve by instructors are to be found in the Reserve Room L112. One may eheck out a book here and go anywhere be chooses in the building to use it; however, all books must be check-ed in, or rechecked at noon, and ngain at six P. M. e remember that books are reserved in order to serve the greatest number—use them quickly. Books still out at these hours will be counted as overdue; thus a fine will be charged.

Call for your book by the author and title, sign the card in the book and leave with the Reserve assistant. Manilla folders on the desk will list all books that are on reserve. These will be labeled with the var-ious Courses. Within the folders the sheets will contain the course number and the instructor's names at the top of each. Following this will appear all books placed on Reserve for this particular course."


