...given an opportunity to obtain information by the first moving motor cars.

On one of McCrary's tours was given charge of a Texas department. Among the persons were listed Mr. and Mrs. E. J. Harger, of Sanger, Tex. department were in Dallas, who had made the trip to Yellowstone Park on his honeymoon.

While taking this group of tourists down the steep Yellow River Grand Canyon one of the persons failed. Throwing the sport on his shoulder, McCrary slowly climbed the zig-zag winding trail. It took him almost 10 minutes to reach a plateau. Leaving the patient in the hands of the physician, McCrary declared, "I never want to do that foot over again during my life, especially from the bottom of a canyon."

Nicknames were applied frequently to persons about the park. McCrary was called "Mr. Dyer," by the doctor at Sanger. Farmers were known as "new-ties" while visitors from the south were called "just plain scotch-ers." McCrary noticed on the fourth that, people

from the south never sounded the final "g" in words and usually said, "Youall" in place of all of you. Scouting single trees and double trees were called white and single hairs, respectively. Transouneans gave themselves away by saying, "Hi, says he." When told that Texas possessed a university, one tourist was greatly amazed by that only rattlesnakes and wild-shooting cowboys remained the Texas open spaces.

During the summer work in the park, McCrary kept a pocket notebook for which he was later given six semester hour credits in Southern Methodist University. The notebook contained information on the stratification of the park soil, with special emphasis placed on the fault lines. Among the notes discovered by McCrary from this summer's research were 1. That the internal source of heat originated within one mile of the earth's surface, and 2. That steam pushed upward instead of downward, as is commonly supposed.

Professor McCrary received his B.A. and M.A. Degrees at the Southern Methodist University in the year of 1927.
