Weakened by injuries and lack of rest, Coach Glenn Maloney's East Texas State Froshmen were battered into submission by the powerful Paris Junior College Dragons last Thursday night on Lion Field in a game witnessed by a large crowd of Lion supporters and Druggery fans who followed their team to Commerce.

The French Club met for the first time at the home of Miss Lutz on Tuesday, October 18, at the home of Miss Lutz.

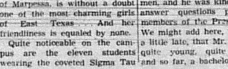
