Darrel Tully Leads Lion Roping Attack

Coach Bob Herrry's East Texas Lions overcame an early lead to conquer the Sam Houston State Teachers College Lions 14-6 on Lion Field here last Friday night in the season's first football game. The largest crowd of the season, including the "Kat" band and a large number of Sam Houston students, witnessed the affair.

Before the crowd was settled into their seats a long parade by Tully was interrupted by the Bears on their own 37 yard line and a wide right pass by Barnett paid a beautiful pass to Crow, waiting in the end zone, who took the ball out in the kick for extra point was good.

With the Sam Houston supporters still shouting over their loudhorns, Darrel Tully opened with a big punt to Hoyer and another to Hoyer to get the "Kats" on defense steps in their own territory. Tully then failed to reverse to two Lions backs starting around right end and slipped around left end to cross the goal line and kick the ball. The equal yardage returned the Lions to the right end and Hoyer kicked the ball for extra point was good.
