Regretting the fact that private equity has been encouraged to invest money in private industry, the Wisconsin man said that the rapid increase in armament expenditures was a mistake. He said, "not just for the purpose of economic stimulation."

Senator LaFollette ended his address with the very stirring conclusion: "We must be convinced—that we can solve our problems."

ELECTION NOTICE

In the following appointment will be voted on Thursday, December 8 in Assembly, Art IV. Election of officers.

A general election for the selection of officers shall be held on the fourth Monday of April of each year.

Should a candidate fail to receive a majority of all votes cast in the general election a runoff election between the two candidates receiving the greatest number of votes must be held on Wednesday of the following week.

2. Notice.—The general election must be given not later than the second Wednesday in April.

3. All Candidates for major offices must file their candidacy with the Student Council not later than the Third Wednesday in April.
