After being tied at seventeen-all at the half Coach Dennis Vinzani's Lion sharpshooters began to trickle through North Texas defenses to run up a heavy lead in the final period, capturing the Eagles, 49 to 35, in the opening conference game for both quarters in Harris Gym last Monday night.

The early part of the battle was nip-and-tuck with the Lions holding a slim lead most of the time. Just before the drop, however, Eagle guard brought a key shot in the basket to tie the score as the half ended.

In the last half it was all East Texas, as J. P. Vinson, Robert Carpenter and H. L. Fite all made more points than the entire Eagle score. Dan Varbo, North Texas' scoring ace, was held to nine points in the game. He was guarded by Janky Bork, captain of the Eagles.

During the third quarter Harkins managed to slip in one field goal for the Eagle's only score while the Lions accumulated 17 points to lead 34 to 17.

High scoring honors went to Vinson of the Lions with seven points. Carpenter and Fite of the Lions tied for runner-up with 10 points each.
