### Journey To San Marcos Tuesday To Meet Bobcats

Friday night at Whitley Gym Coach Dennis Vindler's Lion cagers play their crucial on-court game when they meet the invading Stephen F. Austin Lumberjacks of Houstonville. Game time is 7:30.

The Lumberjacks play North Texas State at Denton Wednesday night, and if they successfully by hand the Eagles are confident they will be within two undefeated league wins of conference championship.

East Texas usually has two conference wins to their credit, and Stephen F. Austin has one.

Coach Bob Stettin's Lumberjacks have the longest road. They defeated Southwest Texas 56 to 27, or by a margin of 29 points. East Texas downed the Bobcats by 15 points, and the Lumberjacks led 13 to 35. However the Lions and Mackay, who have won seven points against the Aggies, still have points more than them in their game with the Klex cagers.

Coach Bob Stettin's Lumberjacks have also picked up an impressive record of conference victories. The big guns of the Aggies are the big fellows and Donnell. Both are accurate and they shoot, accounting for twenty and sixteen points respectively. In the Aggies' own conference with the Bobcats.

A farm boy, and that the first school he attended was a one-room school in East County. He further "admits" with probable pride, that his first job after college was teacher in the same one-teacher school he attended as a boy.

When he was sixteen years old, Dr. Ferguson was admitted to Stephenville College. "This school was later adopted by the state and is now called John Farlow Agricultural College." At the time Dr. Ferguson was at the school, it offered four years work but was not authorized to confer degrees. He majored in English and mathematics, and at the end of four years "he returned to his home community to teach school."

To get his B. A. Degree, Dr. Ferguson went to Polytechnic College in Fort Worth, and did another year's work. After taking his degree, he was employed as one of the three teachers at the academy four years. Dr. Ferguson resigned and went to the University of Texas to work on his Master's Degree. At this time the University would not accept much work from other schools, and Dr. Ferguson had to work another year there and take still another B. A. Degree. However, in 1909 he took his Master's Degree and secured another position as teacher.

This job was in Temple High School, and Dr. Ferguson was employed as principal and English teacher in the High School at Martin, Texas. In 1913, after being at Martin three years, he was made superintendent of schools and held that position until 1925, when he came to East Texas State Teachers College as Dean of the College.

Dr. Ferguson says he has enjoyed teaching and has been proud of every school job he has ever held. He still teaches a course in "The Philosophy of Education," often in the fall term of each school year. However, he admits that administration is the favorite phase of school work.
