# Witcher Burns The Cinders In Brilliant 9.5 Century Dash At El Paso Meet

## Bex Lions Keep Undeclared Record At Southwestern Meet

Featured by a spectacular 9.5 second victory by Earl Witcher in the 100 yard dash, a mark which ranks 27 second from the official world record—the East Texas State Teachers College track meet Saturday—was the smashing triumph to retain the championship of the Southwestern Relays.

East Texas State rolled up 35 1/2 points to advantage the college field. Howard Payne 29, 1928 Arizona 14, N. M. Agave 4, 12, Texas Tech 5, N. M. U. 11, 1929 Missouri 10, 1928 University of Arkansas 9, 1928 Airborne State of Temple 6, Texas Mines 2, and N. M. Mines 1-1/2.

In setting his brilliant 9.5 mark in the century dash, Earl Witcher won by two yards over Milo Melanconch, Airnon University, who set the meet record of 10 seconds last year. Legging it in a blur of speed, Witcher raced down the cinders in front to turn in the best performance of the Relays, and re-established a meet record which should stand for many years.
