Student Election Arouses Interest

Play Written By Associate Editor To Be Published

Edward Mearns, associate editor of the East Texan, has been notified by the National Council for Association of Arts at Washington, D. C. that his original play, "The Valley of the Shadow," has been accepted by that organization, and will be published in pamphlet form in presentation soon.

The play is in act and act for approximately one hour fifteen minutes. The scene is laid in France, at an old abandoned home behind the lines, now a case hospital for the allied armies. The action takes place at the afternoon and evening of a certain October, 1918. There are only three characters in the play, an American army officer receiving from a wound received in battle, a German-French nurse, and a French doctor.

The play is somewhat different in its setting in that it was written for outdoor presentation on the stage. However, it may be adapted easily to any stage.

"The Valley of the Shadow" is the first play that Mearns has ever written. He has attempted several short stories and a longer one, but he has never been successful in this field. He hopes to produce other plays which will be "first class."

According to those who have read the play, it is a masterpiece of good work. Mrs. Florence Brewer says she has read it with interest. The National Council for Prevention of War, and a writer of books, is in her letter to the author "It seems to me extremely effective." Others who have seen the manuscript praise it highly.
